## Reading

### Pie Graph

Create a pie graph of your classmates' reading habits: mystery, fantasy, horror, romance, and nonfiction.

### Line Graph

Create a line graph that tracks the amount of time you spend reading during at least a two-week period of time.

### Bar Graph

Create a bar graph that compares the amount of time your classmates spend each day reading books, print newspapers, magazines, and online articles.

### Table

Create a table that displays the personality, habits, strengths, and weaknesses of the characters in a book you are reading.

### Diagram

Create a diagram of a setting from an important scene in a book or play you are reading.

### Time Line

Create a time line to track the plot of a classroom reading assignment.

### Infographic

Create an infographic that provides interesting facts about a book you recently read.

## Writing

### Pie Graph

Create a pie graph that shares key information from one of your expository or persuasive essays.

### Bar Graph

Create a bar graph that shares key information from one of your expository or persuasive essays.

### Table

Create a table about the characters you want to develop in a short story. List characters down the left column and attributes across the top line.

### Time Line

Create a time line of key plot points you want to cover in a fictional or personal story.

### Flowchart

Use a flowchart as a planning tool to outline the key points of a classroom writing assignment.

Create an infographic of different types of phrases and how they function.
